2. BACKGROUND: Reference 1.b, was hand delivered 14 February 2005 and outlined steps suggested  
by Fort Bliss to assure there would be no ponding or run-on of storm water at Dona Ana Landfill # 11,  
FTBL-011/SWMU 29.

3. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT:

a. Upon return to Fort Bliss, 22 February 2005, Tuesday, the undersigned had an undated phone  
message from David Cobrain, NMED HW/CA Section, approving the actions proposed in Reference 1.b.

4. ACTION: If this verbal approval is incorrect please respond in writing to the point of contact listed  
below in writing within ten (10) business days. If no response is received, Fort Bliss will seek to obtain  
funding and proceed with this work as follows:


a. Survey the area bounded by the two larger-scale arroyos east and west of FTBL-11/SWMU-27  
and bounded by the Tank Trail to the north and a secondary road south of FTBL-11/SWMU-27.  
The survey data will be generated from spot elevations spaced 50-feet on center and will be used  
to develop a contour map with 1-foot intervals.

SUBJECT: **Verbal Approval** to Fort Bliss Response on FTBL-011/SWMU 29 portion of NMED Letter "Approval with Modifications for Voluntary Corrective Action Report for FTBL-11/SWMU-29, U.S. Army Air Defense Artillery Center and Fort Bliss."

- b. Survey the area bounded by the two larger-scale arroyos east and west of FTBL-11/SWMU-27 and bounded by the Tank Trail to the north and a secondary road south of FTBL-11/SWMU-27. The survey data will be generated from spot elevations spaced 50-feet on center and will be used to develop a contour map with 1-foot intervals.
- c. Construct a berm at the breach in the Tank Trail north of FTBL-11/SWMU-27 and deepen the drainage ditch to route run-off to either the east or west forks. The earthwork will be reinforced or armored, if needed.
- d. Construct a new diversion channel between the Tank Trail and FTBL-11/SWMU-27 to capture run-off and route it to the west and into the diversion channel east of FTBL-12/SWMU-29. The earthwork will be reinforced or armored, if needed.
- e. Install ciber stakes and signage along the Tank Trail earthwork to prevent future interference with the drainage system or berm.
