I called John Gould at 2:00 pm.

We talked about the earlier matter of the post-closure plan. I told John that it had become clear that we should not proceed with review of a closure plan until KAFB has completed an inventory of hazardous waste at the lagoons and pond. Then KAFB can proceed with closure knowing by core data the depth of contamination, making the estimate of inventory, and submitting and implementing a clean closure or a closure in place, whichever is shown appropriate by the data.

John agreed with this proposition. He said that Ralph Wilcox is still out with family problems, but that John could speak with Dennis Lundquist (OEHL) who oversees the contract for KAFB to get the ball rolling on a coring project. KAFB will determine when it can get the money and when EID can have the results, then EID will determine if KAFB's proposal is reasonable and issue a directive to KAFB to have coring data available by a given date, in lieu of which EID would initiate an enforcement action to compel KAFB to submit the data and the closure plan and post-closure plan (if applicable).
