NOTICE is hereby given that on April 18 and 22, 1997, Colorado Greenhouse, Inc., 8611 Weld County Road, 31, Fort Lupton, Colorado, filed Application No. E-3-B-A and E-3-B-A-9 with the STATE ENGINEER for a permit to change purpose of use of Underground Waters within the Estancia Underground Water Basin.

The applicant proposes to use existing Wells No. E-3-B-11 and E-3-B-12, located within the 50% NE4 and 50% SE4, respectively, both in Section 10, Township 5 North, Range 8 East, NMPM, on land owned by the applicant, to divert 2.5 acre-feet of water per acre per annum for the continued irrigation of up to 244.4 acres of Licensed land, owned by the applicant, described as 111.7 acres in the SE4 and 132.7 acres in the NE4, all in said Section 10, and for commercial greenhouse purposes on 40 acres of land within the above described 111.7 acres of land in the SE4 of said Section 10. The purpose of use will change from traditional irrigation to a combination of traditional irrigation and commercial greenhouse agriculture. The 2 proposed greenhouses will each cover an area of approximately 20 acres. Appropriation of water for all uses combined shall not exceed 611 acre-feet per annum. No new appropriation is requested under this application.

Any person, firm or corporation or other entity objecting that the granting of the application will be detrimental to the objector's water right shall have standing to file objections or protests. Any person, firm or corporation or other entity objecting that the granting of the application will be contrary to the conservation of water within the state or detrimental to the public welfare of the state and showing that the objection will be substantially and specifically affected by the granting of the application shall have standing to file objections or protests. Provided, however, that the State of New Mexico or any of its branches, agencies, departments, boards, instrumentalities or institutions and all political subdivisions of the state and their agencies, instrumentalities and institutions shall have standing to file objections or protests. The objections or protests shall be in writing and shall set forth specific reasons why the application should not be approved and must be filed, in triplicate, with Thomas C. Turney, State Engineer, 3311 Carondelet NE, Suite A, Albuquerque, New Mexico 87107, within ten (10) days after the date of the last publication of this Notice. Valid objections or protests must be legible, signed and include a complete mailing address. If no valid objection or protest is filed, the State Engineer will evaluate the application for impairment to existing water rights, public welfare of the state, and conservation of water within the state. STATE OF NEW MEXICO SEVERANCE TAX REFUNDING BONDS - SERIES 1997A

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Board of Finance (the "Board") of the State of New Mexico (the "State") will receive and publicly open sealed bids for the purchase of the State of New Mexico Severance Tax Refunding Bonds, Series 1997A (the "Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of \$62,660,000, on Tuesday, May 27, 1997, at 11:00 a.m., prevailing Mountain Time (the "Deadline"), in the Governor's Conference Room, Fourth Floor, State Capitol Building, Santa Fe, New Mexico. The Board also will consider at a meeting to be held at that same time adoption of a resolution accepting the bid of the successful bidder for the Bonds (the "Successful Bidder") and a resolution authorizing the issuance and sale of the Bonds.

DESCRIPTION OF ISSUE: The Bonds will refund certain outstanding severance tax bonds of the State and will be issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$62,660,000, will be dated June 1, 1997, and will mature on July 1, 1998 and serially thereafter.

...in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Severance Tax Bonding Act, Section 7-27-1 through Section 7-27-27 NMSA 1978, as amended (the "Act"). Pursuant to the Act, on June 30 and December 31 of each year, the excess money in the Severance Tax Bonding Fund over the amount necessary to meet all principal and interest payments on outstanding bonds payable from the Severance Tax Bonding Fund and will thereafter be unavailable to make payments of principal or interest on the Bonds. The Bonds are being issued and sold for the purpose of providing funds to refund and redeem certain outstanding severance tax bonds of the State.

INTEREST RATE: Bidders must specify the rate or rates of interest to be borne by the Bonds, provided that each rate bid must be in a multiple of 1/4 or 1/8 of one percent per annum. Zero rate of interest may not be specified. All Bonds of one maturity must bear only one stated rate and the stated rate may exceed by more than three percent (3%) per annum the stated rate with respect to any other maturity.

GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT: A good faith deposit does not need to accompany each bid. However, all bids, except the bid of the State if it is received, shall be subject to the delivery, by the apparent Successful Bidder, of a deposit equal to two percent (2%) of the principal amount of the Bonds, i.e., \$1,253,200 (the "Good Faith Deposit"), which shall be wire transferred to the State's account within one hour of notification by the State that the bid is the apparent successful one, in accordance with the instructions given at the time of the notification.

ADDRESS OF BIDS: Sealed bids, plainly marked "For Sale of New Mexico Severance Tax Refunding Bonds, Series 1997A" should be addressed and delivered in person or by courier or agent by 10:00 a.m., prevailing Mountain Time, on May 27, 1997, to: State Board of Finance, State of New Mexico, Office of the Governor, Fourth Floor, State Capitol Building, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87500

Bids which are not received at or before the Deadline shall not be considered. Bids must be submitted on the Official Bid form on a reasonable facsimile thereof.

LEGAL OPINION AND TRANSCRIPT: The validity and legality of the Bonds will be approved by Guin, Thayer & Brown, a Professional Corporation, Albuquerque, New Mexico, Bond Counsel of the State ("Bond Counsel"), whose approving opinion, together with a complete transcript of the legal proceedings, will be furnished to the purchaser without charge.

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE: The Board will agree by means of a Continuing Disclosure Undertaking to be delivered, to provide certain Annual Financial Information relating to the State by not later than 180 days after the end of each fiscal year of the State, commencing with fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, and to provide notices of occurrence of certain enumerated events. The Board will further agree in the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking that if its audited financial statements are not provided as part of the Annual Financial Information, the Board will provide such audited statements when available. The Annual Financial Information and audited financial statements (when available) will be filed by the Board with each Nationally Recognized Municipal Securities Information Depository and with any New Mexico State Information Depository. Only comments and/or requests received by NMED during the 60-day public comment period will be considered. NMED will provide a thirty (30) day notice of a public hearing, if scheduled. After the conclusion of the 60-day comment period, NMED will respond to the public comments received. All written comments submitted on the permit modifications will be considered on formulating a final decision. NMED may modify the permit(s) based on the comments received. NMED will notify KAFB and each person who submitted a written comment during the public comment period about the final decision. After consideration of all written comments received, NMED will approve, or modify and approve the permit(s) modifications, if NMED modifies and approves the permit(s) modifications then NMED shall provide KAFB with a detailed written statement of reasons for the modifications and the modified permit(s) will become the approved permit modifications. A copy of the modified pages of the Container Storage Unit permit with a detailed statement of the reasons for the modifications will be mailed to KAFB.
