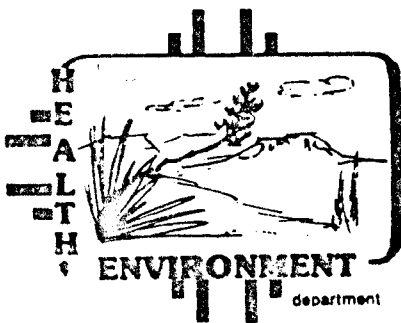

Dear Mr. Plum:

This Division has received your notice of intent to discharge produced waters from your ground water monitoring work located in Albuquerque in Bernalillo County, New Mexico. This notice was submitted as required in Section 1-201 of the New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission Regulations.

Based on presently available information, including the information in your notice of intent to discharge, a discharge plan is not being required for this discharge as long as the discharge is as described.

A discharge plan is not being required because it does not appear that this discharge may move directly or indirectly into ground water.

Please also be advised that even though a discharge plan is not being required for this discharge, this does not relieve you of liability should your operation result in actual pollution of surface or ground waters or other environmental problems which may be actionable under other laws and/or regulations.

If at sometime in the future you intend to change the amount, the character or the location of your discharge so that it will not be as described, or if observation or monitoring shows that it is not as described, you should file a new notice of intent to discharge with the Ground Water and Hazardous Waste Bureau of this Division.
